### Transportation

The City is served by I-70; I-75 (20 miles west); I-71 (30 miles south); and US Routes 40 and 68; Ohio Routes 4, 41, 72 and 334. Rail freight service is provided locally by the Indiana & Ohio Central Railroad (IOCR), Conrail, and CN Grand Trunk. Intermodal and reload sites are available. SCAT provides local bus service. Dayton, Columbus and Cincinnati International Airports are within 30 to 90 minute drive time.

### Education

The city school system includes a high school, a career technology center, 4 middle schools, 10 elementary schools, and 7 parochial schools. In addition, Clark State Community College and Wittenberg University are located within the city. Within a 25 mile radius there also exists Wright State University, the University of Dayton, Antioch College, Cedarville College, Sinclair Community College, Urbana University, Central State University, and Wilberforce University.

### Library Services

The Clark County Public Library provides services through the main downtown facility along with four branches and three bookmobiles. Over 300,000 volumes are available. A 100 seat meeting room is also available.

## Water Supply

- The City's existing 12 wells are capable of producing 4.0 million gallons per day (MGD) each, for a combined capacity of 48.0 MGD of high quality groundwater.
- The City and Clark County work together to enforce a wellhead protection plan, developed in partnership with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.
- The City's treatment plant has a peak capacity of 36.0 MGD and is capable of sustained production of 28.0 MGD.
- The City's distribution system consists of about 317 miles of water mains, one booster station and four (4) finished water reservoirs for a combined capacity of 8.5 MG.
- The City has replaced every water meter in our system with meters that are read electronically and remotely.
- Current customer demand is only 12.8 MGD.
- \* The City has the ability to meet the supply needs of virtually any new customer. The City has the fourth lowest water rates in the Miami Valley region.

## Wastewater Facilities

The City of Springfield operates an Advanced Secondary Wastewater Treatment Plant.

- The treatment plant has a rated treatment capacity of 25.0 MGD with the ability to handle up to 32.0 MGD during wet weather flow conditions.
- The average daily flow rate for 2001 was about 15.4 MGD, leaving ample capacity for new or expanding developments.
- The City operates a satellite plant located at the Springfield-Beckley Municipal Airport.
- \* The airport plant has an operating capacity of 70,000 gallons per day to serve airport facilities and AirparkOhio.
